Leader: We pray for the leaders and people of Zambia, that they may be blessed with wisdom, peace, and prosperity.

All: May God’s grace abound in their lives, and may they know His presence in all things.

Leader: Together, we affirm our commitment to our partnership, praying for continued growth in faith, hope, and love.

All: In the name of Christ, our Lord. Amen.

Prayer for Zambia / Bath & Wells Sunday

Loving God and Father of us all, today we pray for our brothers and sisters in the Zambia Anglican Church.

We give thanks for the 48 years in which we have celebrated life and faith together through our Diocesan Companion Link.

We give thanks for the prayers, for the friendships, for the joys and for the concerns that we have shared.

And we give thanks for all that we have learned from each other as we have sought to live and tell the Good News of Jesus Christ.

We ask for your continuing blessing on us as together we strive to “come to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to maturity, to the measure of the full stature of Christ”.

Confession and Absolution

Leader: In the presence of God, who binds us together in love and mission, let us confess our sins, acknowledging our shared humanity and the grace that unites us across continents.

All: We confess that we have not always lived as one body in Christ. We have failed to love our neighbours as ourselves and have not worked for justice and peace.

Lord, have mercy.

Leader: We recognise that we have been slow to listen and quick to judge and have not always sought reconciliation.

Christ, have mercy.

All: We have kept our resources to ourselves and have not shared generously with those in need.

Lord, have mercy.

Leader: May Almighty God have mercy on us, forgive us our sins, and bring us to everlasting life.

All: Amen.

OR Leader: May the God of all mercy and love, who has reconciled the world to himself through the death and resurrection of his Son, Jesus Christ, forgive us all our sins, and grant us peace.

All: Amen.

Alternatively:

Lord God, our maker and our redeemer,
this is your world, and we are your people:
come among us and save us.

We have wilfully misused your gifts of creation;

Lord, be merciful:

forgive us our sin.

We have seen the ill-treatment of others
and have not gone to their aid;

Lord, be merciful:

forgive us our sin.

We have condoned evil and dishonesty
and failed to strive for justice;

Lord, be merciful:

forgive us our sin.

We have heard the good news of Christ,
but have failed to share it with others;

Lord, be merciful:

forgive us our sin.

We have not loved you with all our heart,
nor our neighbours as ourselves;

Lord, be merciful:

forgive us our sin.

May God who loved the world so much
that he sent his Son to be our Saviour
forgive *us our* sins
and make *us* holy to serve him in the world,
through Jesus Christ our Lord.
